- IV. Updates/Presentations of Reports

- A. Business Office: Meeting with the HA to look at some budget numbers. Still waiting on 80<sup>th</sup> day to be finalized. We need those numbers to be correct and are waiting on that.
- B. Principals/Staff Representative(s): Mary Ellen Dannenberg, ES Principal: Came back from Winter break with several snow days. WinterFest was rescheduled and amazing. Early Childhood had Explora visit and many families came and enjoyed. Also, Explora will be starting this Friday for aftercare. Clubs have started for aftercare and are already started. They have now been opened up to families outside of aftercare. Mondays is Reading Quest along with Spanish and Basketball. We are turning aftercare into a place where a child can come and learn and do fun activities. Brett Barker, Elementary Rep: Nothing to report, just getting a feel for the meetings first. We had several snow days, some transition with curriculum and evening out. Still struggling with Istation. Would like a discussion about authentic assessment. Joe Dan Lovato, MS Principal: WIDA ACCESS testing started today and we almost hit on everybody. Most students showed up for the first day of testing. He had the pleasure of sitting in with 5<sup>th</sup> grade and Middle School bands and was very proud of what they got to showcase. The ground work for the barn is starting. Working on SEL push-ins right now. A schedule has been sent out and the first topics will be bullying, hazing and harassment. Yearbook is also coming together. Negotiating details. We had a couple of families last week and want to enroll their kids next Monday. Looking to partner with Math Amigos, to support MS with afterschool programing and tutoring. We are talking about DATA. MOY data has been rolled out. Looking at MAP assessment for Science. We have been a bit short handed and he was able to step into a few classes to sub. Madeline Woods, Middle School Staff Rep: Made some controlled clouds with the 6<sup>th</sup> graders. Has had many students show up for her after school gardening club. Request from GC some sort of clarification for the community for the barn. Joe Dan explains a bit and has a plan for the community communication.
- C. Head Administrator: WinterFest went really well. The students were so excited about it and it was great seeing so many people coming into the building for the festival. Kinder, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3 8 have finished MOY testing. 2<sup>nd</sup> grade will come later because of Istation.

We have seen some growth in some areas but there is still room for improvement. We are now focusing on SEL. We are focusing on appropriate school language and proper conduct. We are going to meet with MS students to discuss a behavior matrix. This will help get them involved and understanding the why behind behavior expectations. And they need both positive and negative consequences. The American Red Cross is coming in to teach students hands only CPR. Expansion is going to be good with all of the groups really getting together and becoming more aligned. We are looking at 2 different financial groups and hope to have more information on which group we decide to go with to help guide with the process. Our lottery currently has 117 applicants in the lottery which is excellent since it just opened up. Yard signs are going up soon with the ground thawing. We have inviting the board members to join the open house for new students, the Spring STEAM Rodeo and concert, Teacher Appreciation week, Staff v Students basketball game and 8th grade promotion.

- V. Report of ELPs and Services provided (ELTP v K12+ v Regular): Stephanie Behning explains about the afterschool clubs moving to the afterschool program as the ELTP no longer exists. This really gives them the opportunity to expand and go out during aftercare to other teachers and other activities. This also helps cut down on any behavior issues.
- VI. Report of Academic Achievement: Stephanie Behning presents on the data comparing the BOY with the MOY. Points out how the pandemic affected our students and how proud we are of them for their improvements now. Also points out how SEL and behavior can affect their scores as well which is why principals are starting to focus on these two aspects of education. After IMASA, Stephanie brings up the Istation results. Many foundational skills were lost during the pandemic and it shows with the older children. Yes, this is being tracked throughout the years. We switched to IMASA to help students be more comfortable with state testing because of the similarities.
